Findings: The day campsite is a church building with indoor facility use of a sanctuary, multi-use area (narthex), bathrooms, and community room. The building includes approximately 4.78 acres with woodlands and open field areas. The facility is conducive to host a day camp program.

B. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Findings: The camp provides care and supervision for children between the ages of five and 12 during the hours of 7:30 AM and 5:15 PM, five days per week (Monday through Friday), June through August. The camp emphasizes team work, fun, creativity, and exploration through a hands-on experience. The camp has weekly themes that emphasize a variety of areas including science, agriculture, cooking, arts and crafts, sports, and animals. Campers are involved in arts and crafts, running games, hikes, extensive nature study, field games, and water games. The staff to camper ratio meets licensing standards. The staff are trained in proper supervision, behavior management, child protection, and program development for age groups. Plans for emergencies, rain, and regular camp PROGRAM operation meet licensing rule compliance.

C. RULE/STATUTORY VIOLATIONS

The camp PROGRAM and SITE were found to be compliant with statute and administrative rules.

RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of an original SITE and PROGRAM licenses to this day children's camp.
